2. Living in a place called home

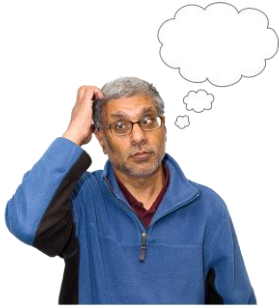
Help people to connect with family, friends and community, in a place where they feel safe and at home.
